John Edmondson

In response to your request for suggestions, might I mention my second edition of *Faunula Grustensis: the Natural History of the Parish of Llanrwst* by John Williams, originally published in 1830 and reissued in 2019? It was first published by the author and printed by John Jones in Llanrwst; the second edition was issued by Cambridge Scholars Publishing (ISBN 978-1-5375-3862-7).

The author takes a broad view of natural history, to include accounts of the agriculture of the area (which was a large parish stretching from Deganwy in the north to Gwydir Forest in the south). His account contains much of interest to the modern environmentalist; he laments the

disappearance of beavers from the valley of the river Conwy at the eponymous Pont y Afanc, deplores the loss of stately mature oak forest from much of the upland areas, and mentions some of the rarest plants to be seen growing in local gardens such as the Snowdon Lily *Lloydia serotina*.

This was a pioneering work; as well as covering its fauna it was only the second published floristic list for a Welsh county or its equivalent (the area it covers includes much of the Snowdonia National Park and falls within the modern County Borough of Conwy).

It was edited by me with some additional material such as a gazetteer, a biography of the author and a bibliography.
